Adjective

Definition: Eager to learn

From the book: A **curious** kitty walked through the snow.

Synonyms: Searching, nosy

Feline

Adjective

Definition: characteristic of the cat family

From the book: His daily dose of **feline** freedom brought him to a school parking lot.

Synonyms: Catlike, sneaky

Keen

Adjective

Definition: Extremely sensitive or responsive

From the book: His **keen** little ears heard car doors open and close.

Synonyms: Sharp, clever

Pounced
verb

Definition: To spring or come suddenly

From the book: A plan **pounced** his kitty mind.

Synonyms: Ambushed, attacked

Rescuing

Noun

Definition: Needing immediate action

From the book: Thinking he might need rescuing, she scooped him up and brought him into the warm school.

Synonym: Saving

Relief

Noun

Definition: Feeling of cheerfulness after removal of stress

From the book: They entered the classroom, and to his **relief**, the children were hushed by a calming sound.

Synonym: Comfort

Twitching

Adjective

Definition: Moving in a quick, jerky way

From the book: He sat as still as a statue,
minus his **twitching** tail.

Synonyms: Shaky, bouncy

Clever
Adjective

Definition: Mentally bright

From the book: The **clever** gray kitty knew it was now urgent for him to reveal his perfect kitty charm.

Synonyms: Quick, Intelligent

Urgent

Adjective

Definition: Needing immediate action

From the book: The clever gray kitty knew it was now **urgent** for him to reveal his perfect kitty charm.

Synonyms: Important, necessary

Mastering
verb

Definition: gathering up

From the book: He curled up in the teacher's lap, **mustering** his loudest purr.

Synonyms: Producing, beginning

Velveteen

Adjective

Definition: Made of velvet; very soft

From the book: Ms. Catsby ran her hand down his **velveteen** coat.

Synonyms: Plush, soft

Advertise
verb

Definition: To give information to the public about

From the book: We could **advertise** the kitty to the school and neighborhood to see if someone lost him.

Synonyms: Announce, display

Snuggled

Verb

Definition: To lie or press closely

From the book: The little gray kitty **snuggled** on the couch.

Synonyms: Cuddle, nestle

Content

Adjective

Definition: The feeling of being satisfied

From the book: Five days had passed and he was feeling purrrfectly **content**.

Synonyms: Happy, satisfied
